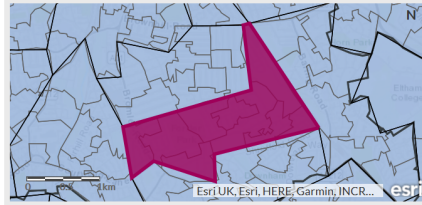


Whitefoot

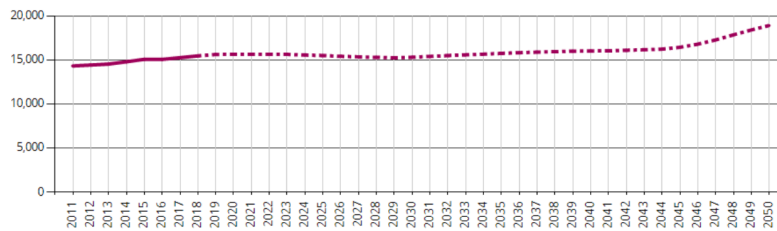

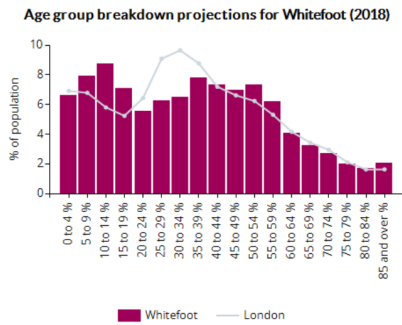

Whitefoot, Population projection

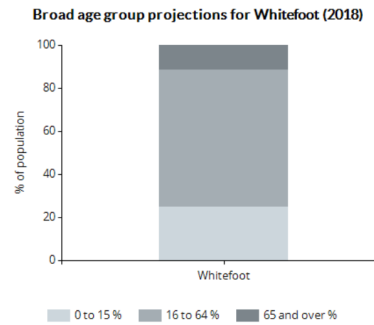


Age group breakdown projections for Whitefoot (2018)

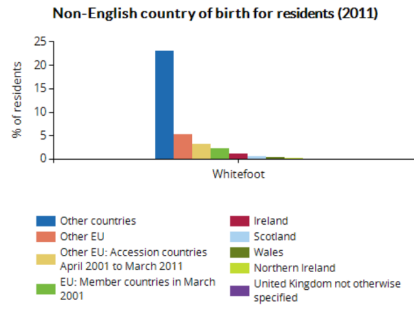

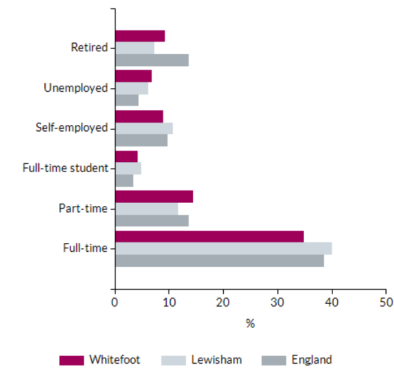

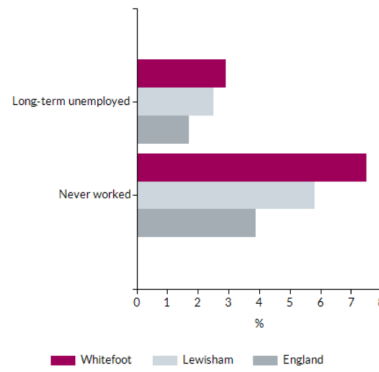

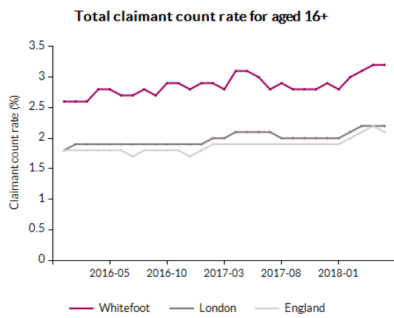

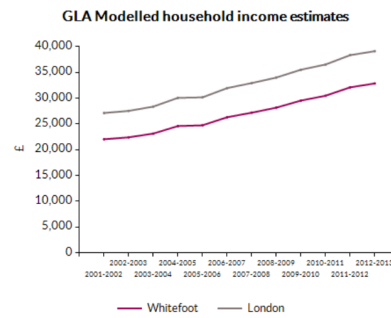

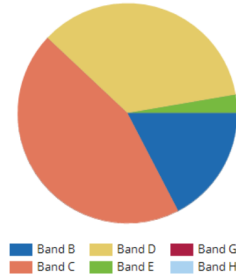
Housing

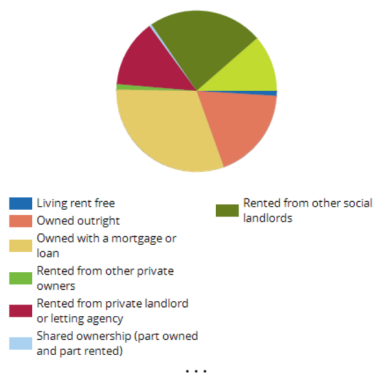

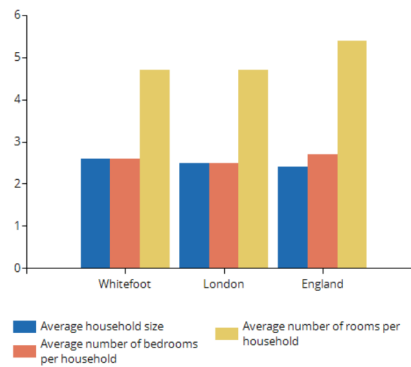

Property ownership in Whitefoot, 2011



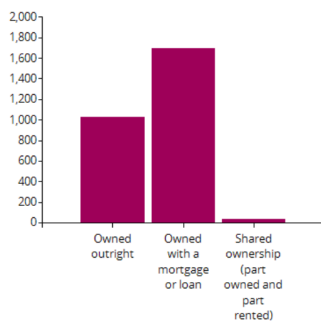

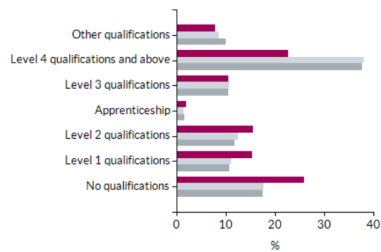

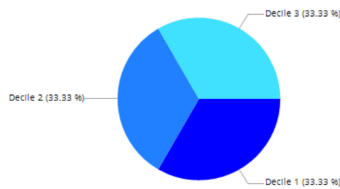

Income Deprivation Affecting Children Index (IDACI) Decile:

The Indices of Deprivation 2015 provide a set of relative measures of deprivation for small areas (Lower-layer Super Output Areas) across England.

The IDACI is a subset of the Income Deprivation Domain, with the Index showing the proportion of children aged 0 - 15 in each Lower-layer Super Output Area that live in families that are income deprived (those that are in receipt of Income Support, income-based Jobseeker's Allowance, Pension Credit Guarantee or Child Tax Credit below a given threshold).

The pie chart shows the proportion of LSOAs in Whitefoot in each decile with decile 1 being the most deprived 10% of areas in England.

Community Safety

This overview section looks at the overall crime figures of the local area as well as the crime rates split by types.

Source:

data.police.uk * = single crime case data have been aggregated to Ward level. Rates are calculated per 1000 population, 12 month rolling figures use an average of the population monthly figures over the same period. Where the dates for the crime data exceed the latest available date for population estimates, the latest population figure was used for any crime rates after that date (no extrapolating).

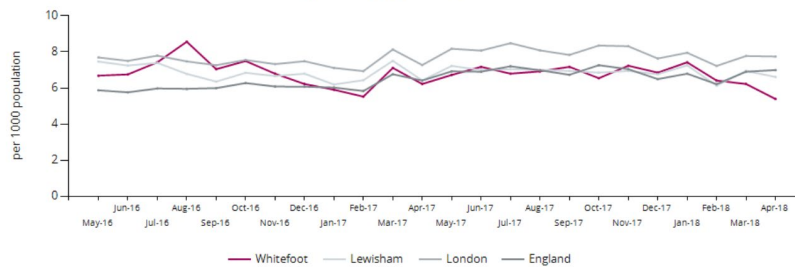

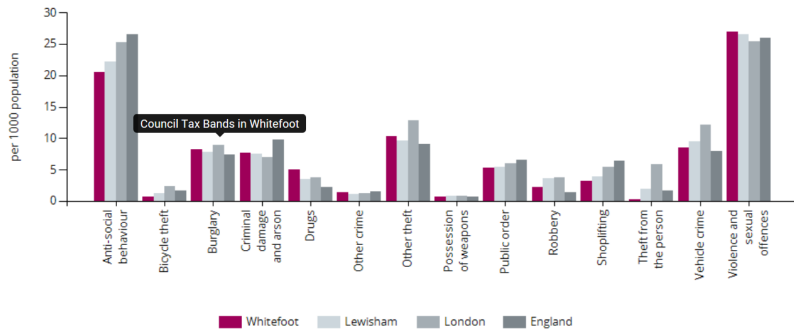

Deprivation

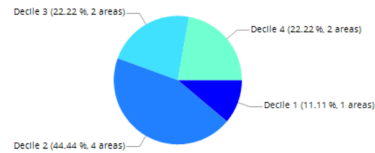
The Index of Multiple Deprivation (IMD) 2015 is the official measure of relative deprivation for small areas (or neighbourhoods) in England. The Index of Multiple Deprivation ranks every small area (Lsoa) in England from 1 (most deprived area) to 32,844 (least deprived area).

For larger areas like Wards we can look at the proportion of LSOAs within the ward that lie within each decile. Decile 1 represents the most deprived 10% of LSOAs in England while decile 10 shows the least deprived 10% of areas.

This section shows information on IMD and the underlying domain indices.

Proportion of LSOAs in Whitefoot by Index of Multiple Deprivation (IMD) Decile



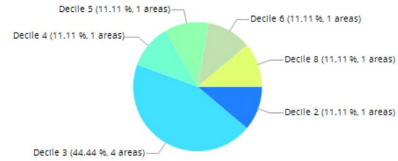

Proportion of LSOAs in Whitefoot by Income Decile



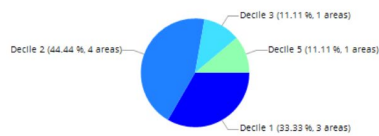

Proportion of LSOAs in Whitefoot by Education, Skills and Training Decile



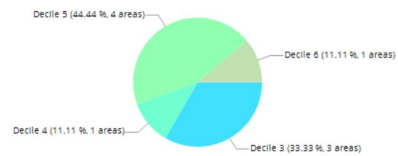

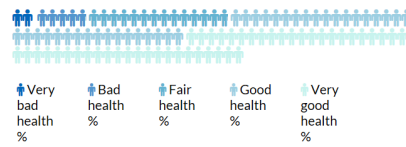

Self reported health per 100 persons (ONS Census 2011)

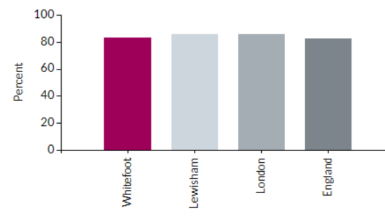


Day-to-day activities limited a lot

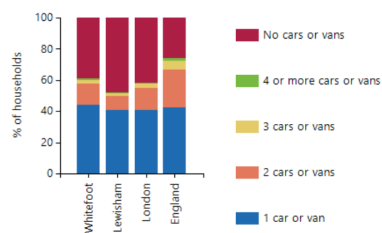

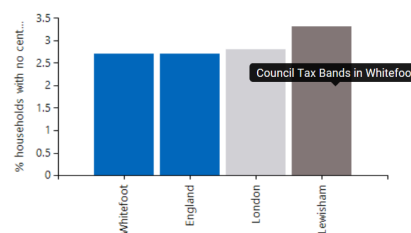
